August 20, 2021


Report Summary

Last week (8/6/21 - 8/12/21), Huron County's case count jumped to 100. For the reporting period for this week (8/13/21 – 8/19/21), the increasing trend continued with 154 new cases of COVID-19 reported in Huron County.


U.S. Overview

This database provides an integrated, county view of key data for monitoring COVID-19 throughout the U.S. in a standardized format with various colors indicating levels of community transmission. The two sets of images below demonstrate a one-week change from 8/12/2021-8/18/2021. As of 8/18/2021, Huron County remains at a high level of transmission. With high transmission, CDC is recommending even individuals who are fully vaccinated to wear a mask in public indoor settings.



Cumulative Data







Current Week Data

For the reporting period of 8/13/2021-8/19/2021, there were **154 new cases** reported. The graphs below indicate positive COVID-19 cases in Huron County for the reporting period of 8/13/2021-8/19/2021, shown by age group* and by zip code (by both case counts and incidence rate).

*One case of COVID-19 was reported with an unknown age.







Please note that all but one Huron County zip codes are reporting positive cases this week, demonstrating that COVID-19 is currently circulating through nearly all communities in Huron County.



Huron County Public Health (HCPH) currently has the Moderna and Pfizer vaccines available for appointments at HCPH's offices in Norwalk. Interested individuals can schedule an appointment at HCPH by calling 419-668-1652 ext. 241 or book an appointment using our online scheduling tool at: https://bit.ly/3xxHh3O. Please bring a valid ID and insurance information to your vaccination appointment; there will be no out-of-pocket cost to individuals. Individuals must be 18+ to receive the Moderna vaccine; individuals 12+ can receive Pfizer.
