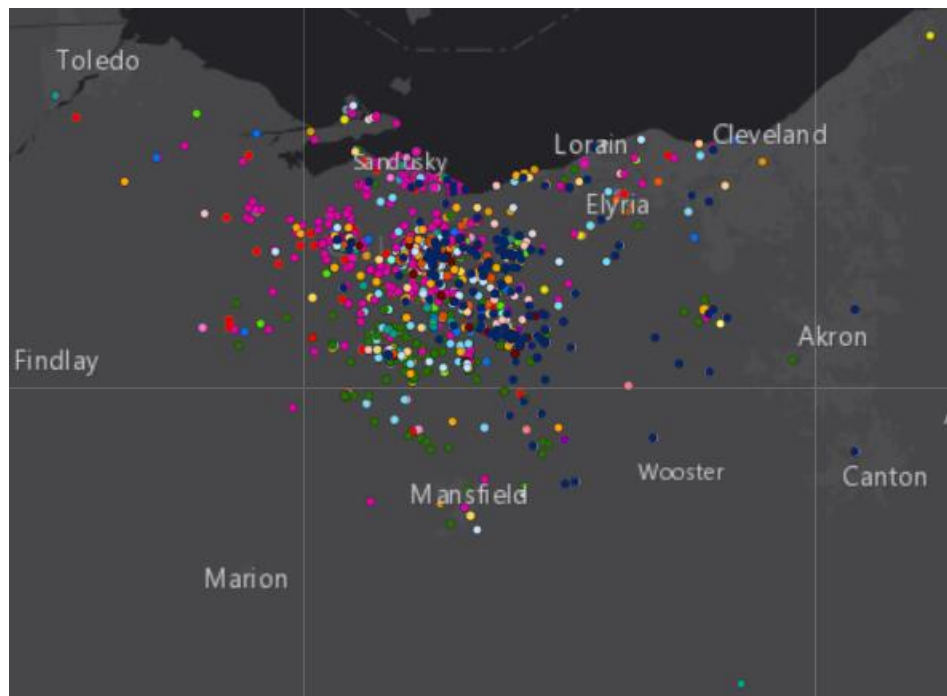

### **COVID-19 Vaccine Update**

#### ***Huron County Public Health's COVID-19 Vaccine Distribution Progress***

This week, Governor DeWine announced a number of expansions to vaccine eligibility, including adding additional qualifying medical conditions and three qualifying occupational categories, as well as extending the age qualifier down to those aged 60+. Johnson & Johnson's vaccine also became available to Ohioans this week; all 300 doses received by HCPH will be administered at a fully booked drive-thru clinic this Saturday, March 6th. Both of these advancements in eligibility and supply will continue to make the COVID-19 vaccine more quickly and widely available to our residents.

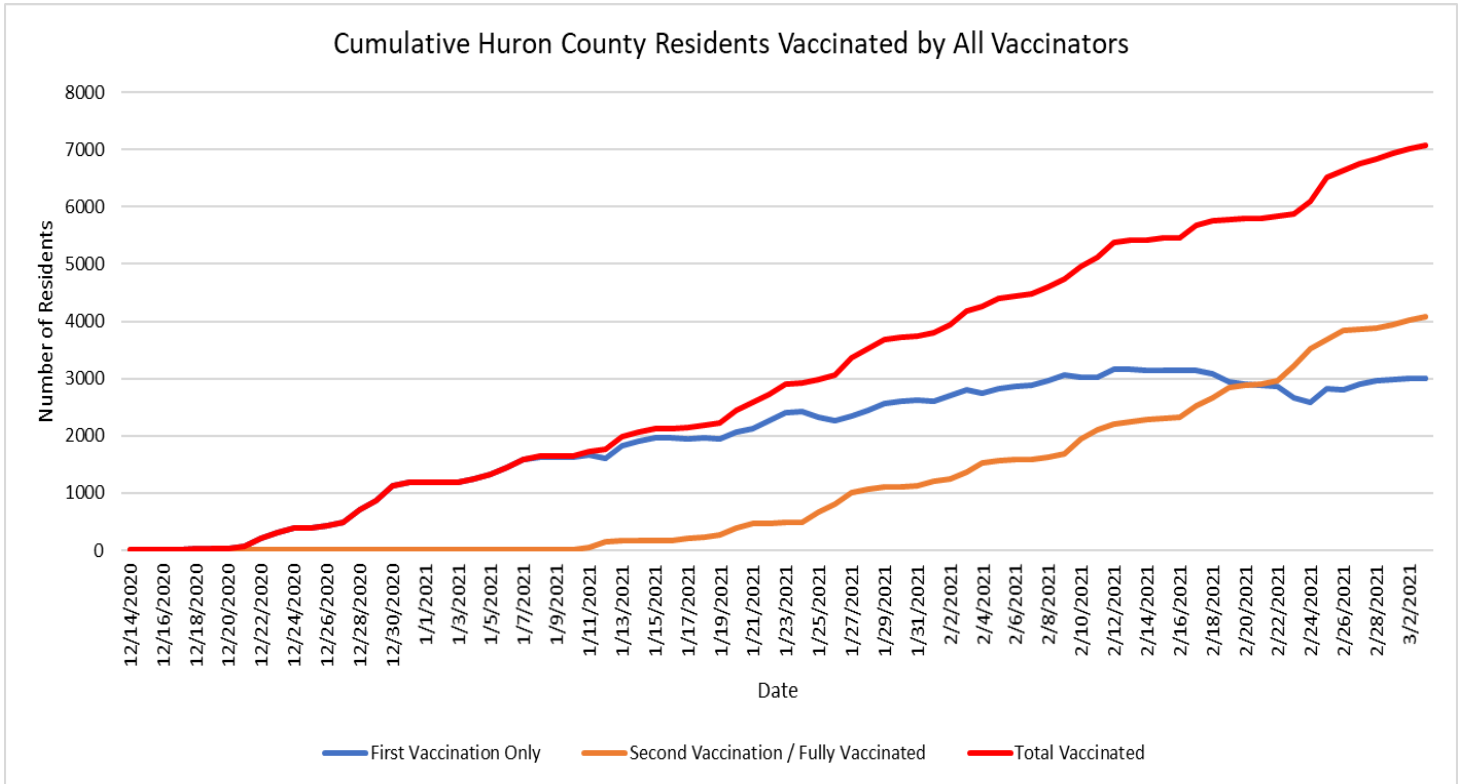
This week, HCPH wrapped up the second round of Huron County school vaccinations and also hosted vaccination clinics for the general public. Note: currently authorized Pfizer and Moderna COVID-19 vaccines require 2 shots to get the most protection, which are given either 21 or 28 days apart, while the newly release Johnson & Johnson vaccine only requires a single-dose shot and is included in the 'Total Vaccinated' category.

### ***State and Local Risk Levels***

As of Thursday, March 4, 2021, Huron County remains an Alert Level Red on the Ohio Department of Health's Ohio Public Health Advisory System. As of Monday, March 1, 2021, Huron County was ranked 19/20 in the top 20 high incidence counties in Ohio for COVID-19. HCPH is urging all residents to assess their own individual risk for illness before leaving their homes, exercise a high degree of caution when in public, and continue to follow all current health orders.
